


OVERVIEW OF THE MONTH

KINGSTON FALL FAIR 2022

This month we participated in the 190th edition of the annual Kingston Fall Fair, which took place between 16-18 September. The event brought together local organizations including the Murney Tower Museum, the Mohawks of the Bay of Quinte, the Frontenac Heritage Foundation, and the Genealogical Society with local communities around games, activities, competitions, community presentations, and of course, food. Our director, Dr. Tabitha Renaud got together with the fair visitors on Sunday, September 18th. In her presentation, she introduced the audience to the history and museums of Kingston and talked about a broad range of topics including the Kingston Historical Society, Murney Tower, and Martello Towers of Kingston. We had a fantastic time meeting with our communities and representing the Kingston museum sector in this important annual event. We hope to participate again next year!
